The 2020 election is now upon us - by now Vote by Mail ballots have been sent and should be arriving in homes as of today. We have been encouraging everyone to VBM as it is the safest way to vote during COVID-19. There has been a lot of concern about the Post Office and the slowing down of mail. Once you get your ballot, the best way to get your voted counted is to fill the form out and mail it back ASAP.

Please be sure to sign the back of the envelope and make sure the privacy sleeve is also folded over the ballot. If that sleeve is missing, your ballot may be rejected.

You can bring your ballot to the closest Supervisor of Elections office (SOE) or drop it in a drop box at the early voting sites. When you VBM, you can follow the progress of your ballot to make sure it was received and if there are any issues with it. Click here to [Track your ballot](#)



As far as I've been able to find out, Florida will begin tabulating votes 22 days before Nov. 3 but will not be totaled until election day. Because this is expected to be a high-turnout election, all officials are stressing the need to get VBM ballots back to the SOE as early as possible. VBM ballots will be included in the results on election night. The concern is that if people wait until just before the election, the ballots may not arrive in time to be recorded on election night.
